

# Once upon a time)

You will write/create a children's story book. The children's book must have at least 10 pages and be illustrated, 10 images. Refer to some of your favourite books growing up (for children or not for children) for inspiration. Choose a story that catches your interests and brings out your talents, may it be an adventure, magic/supernatural or mystery/riddle.

### Story Writing Curricular Objectives (I will be able to.....)

- comprehend and express oral or written messages involving a variety of language functions related to various contexts and communicative purposes.
- use time clues to determine if the message is being expressed in the past, present, future,
- as part of the editing process, work with a peer to read aloud a prepared production to determine if the message is clear
- apply knowledge of conjugation patterns in the present tense with frequently-used regular verbs
- apply knowledge of the formation of le passé composé and l'imparfait for frequently-used regular verbs
- understand the formation of the conditional twith frequently-used verbs
- apply knowledge of le futur proche and le futur simple and including aller, avoir, être and faire, e.g., j'irai, tu
  auras, il sera, elle fera


